JOINT ACTIVITIES BETWEEN RedLAC NCP, EURAXESS y NET4MOBILITY+

In the context of the current situation during May we made two webinars together with colleagues from Euraxess in Brazil and Mexico and from the Net4mobility + Project in order to spread information of the Individual Fellowships (IF) and Global Fellowships (GF) of the Marie Sklodowska-Curie (now open to receive applications).

The MSCA Individual Actions (IF) calls are aimed at: increasing the creative and innovative potential of experienced researchers (RE), giving them opportunities to acquire new knowledge, work on research projects in a European context or outside Europe.

Which candidates are eligible?

- Those experienced researchers who have a doctorate or can prove 4 years of research experience (counting from the time the qualification for a doctorate is obtained)
- Those who can comply with the mobility rule: the candidates cannot have resided/ worked in the Third Country with which they request the project for a certain time
- There is no age limit
- Restriction to nationality that can be supplied if there has been a long-term residence in Europe at any time during the research career.



CiQUS Offers Short-Term Stays and Specialized Support to MSCA-IF-2020 Candidates

CiQUS wants to support excellent researchers in their applications to MSCA-IF-2020 Individual Fellowships. The selected candidates will be invited to carry out one week stay at CiQUS with our research groups, working together towards submit an application to MSCA-IF-2020 call and join our research center.

They will spend some days within the selected Labs, discussing the project with the Host PI and meeting with MSCA evaluators. The candidates will be also supported by our technical staff for the draft proposal writing, both during and after the stay.

How to Apply:

Candidates can apply until June 15, 2020.

- 1. Select the appropriate research group / s for your project idea. Find the lines of research available at the following link: www.usc.es/ciqus/en/research/research-groups
- Send a pdf with your cover letter and short CV (maximum 2 pages) to ciqus.jobs@usc.es (subject "MSCA-2020"). Include in the cover letter some lines that summarize the basic idea of your proposal, which must coincide with the available lines of research. The list of publications can be provided through the ORCID / Scopus / ResearcherID profiles).
- 3. Requests will be dealt with on a first-come, first-served basis. Shortlisted candidates must submit a short research proposal (1-2 pages). The selected candidates will be invited to spend a week at CiQUS



About CiQUS:

CiQUS (University of Santiago de Compostela), addresses the challenges in **biological** and medicinal chemistry, new functional materials and synthetic technologies for sustainable development.

Currently, CiQUS houses 18 research groups that have been **awarded 8 ERC projects** (1 AdG, 1 CoG, 3 StG, 3 PoC), in addition to ensuring an **average of 6.1 MEUR / year** in competitive funds during 2017- 2019. Regarding scientific contributions, they reached an average JCR **impact factor of 7.55** during the same period.

State Program for the Generation of Knowledge and Scientific and Technological Strengthening of the R+D+i System

<u>General description</u>: aid aimed at equipping public and private research organizations with the structure and knowledge necessary for the proper promotion, preparation, support and management of European projects, so that research organizations improve their chances of obtaining Community financing in the Framework Program for Research and Innovation of the European Union for the period 2021-2027, Horizon Europe, during the period of execution of the activity subject to the aid, which covers the years 2021 and 2022.

Budget: 7,000,000 euros.

<u>Beneficiaries</u>: non-profit research and knowledge dissemination organizations with their own legal personality that are validly constituted and have a residence, tax residence or a permanent establishment in Spain, such as:

- Public research organizations defined in article 47 of Law 14/2011, of June 1, on Science, Technology and Innovation,
- Public and private universities with demonstrated capacity and activity in R&D, in accordance with the provisions of Organic Law 6/2001,
- Public and private health entities and institutions linked or arranged with the National Health System, that carry out R+D+i activities,
- Health research institutes accredited in accordance with the provisions of Royal Decree 279/2016, of June 24
- Technological centers of state scope and Support Centers for Technological Innovation of state scope validly registered at the time of the presentation of the application in the register of centers regulated by Royal Decree 2093/2008, of December 18,

Open Call for Evaluators



CONEX-Plus is a training and mobility program that aims to accelerate the career development of a cohort of Experienced Researchers at UC3M in Spain. CONEX-Plus will offer 30 fellowships of 36 months each, for incoming mobility to UC3M.

Building on the excellence of UC3M, the program will develop the next generation of research leaders in the strategic research areas that are identified in the Research and Innovation Strategy for Smart Specialisation (RIS3) strategy of the Madrid Autonomous Region, underpinned by Social Sciences and Humanities.

In the course of activities around CONEX PLUS will need international external evaluators to review proposals. These evaluators will need to be experts in the field of:

- Advanced materials, Manufacturing Technologies and Space
- Energy, environment and transport (including aeronautics)
- Health and Biotechnology
- Information Technologies and Communications
- Social Sciences and Humanities

The International Service Facility supporting International Cooperation in Research and Innovation

What is the so called "International Service Facility" of the European Commission?

The 'Service Facility supporting International Cooperation in Research and Innovation' assists the European Commission in bilateral, multilateral and bi-regional policy dialogues in research and innovation with third countries and regions and identifies opportunities for increased cooperation, including the support of National Contact Points (NCPs) in European Union Partner Countries.

The German project management agency DLR-PT is lead contractor for the Service Facility, which started in 2017 and will end in 2021. The following services are aiming specifically at Latin American and Caribbean countries (LAC):

- Supporting Horizon 2020 NCPs in EU Partner Countries
- Communication activities for international cooperation
- R&I Policy advice to support CELAC countries in addressing the Sustainable Development Goals through research and innovation
- Support to the EU-CELAC Joint initiative on Research and Innovation (JIRI)
- Support to the EU-LAC Working Group on Research Infrastructures
- Support to the organisation of an EU-LAC Innovation Cooperation Conference





Latin American and Caribbean National Contact Points Network

¿What is it?

The Latin American and Caribbean National Contact Points Network (Red LAC NCP) is made up of all the National Contact Points officially designated by a CELAC State through the main competent body in Science, Technology and Innovation and which have been recognized by the European Commission through its official appointment

Main objectives?

The **objective** of the LAC NCP Network is to promote and increase the participation of academia, companies and institutions in the Horizon 2020 Program in order to democratize access opportunities among the different countries of the Region.

The aim is to create an efficient and dynamic, proactive and sustainable network to stimulate closer cooperation between all national contact points in Europe, Latin America and the Caribbean.

Its **specific objectives** are: to strengthen the designation and motivation of the NCPs in the CELAC region and to improve the participation of these countries in H2020.

How does it work?

The NCPs are named for each of the thematic areas of the H2020 Program, as well as for the transversal areas. The structure is the following one:



Type of Action	Description
RIA - Research and Innovation Actions	Activities aiming to establish new knowledge and/or to explore the feasibility of a new or improved technology, product, process, service or solution. For this purpose they may include basic and applied research, technology development and integration, testing and validation on a small-scale prototype in a laboratory or simulated environment. Projects may contain closely connected but limited demonstration or pilot activities animing to show technical feasibility in a near to operational environment.
CSA - Coordination and Support Actions	Accompanying measures such as standardisation, dissemination, awareness-raising and communication, networking, coordination or support services, policy dialogues and mutual learning exercises and studies.
ERA-NET Cofund	Supports public-public partnerships, including joint programming initiatives between Member States, in their preparation, establishment of networking structures, implementation of joint activities as well as Union topping-up of a trans-national call for proposals. It allows for programme collaboration in any part of the entire research-innovation cycle. The main and compulsory activity of the ERA-NET Cofund is the implementation of the co-funded joint call for proposals to fund trans-national research and innovation projects.
MSCA - Marie Skłodowska-Curie Actions To know more click <u>here</u> .	The Marie Sklodowska-Curie actions (MSCA) provide grants for all stages of researchers' careers - be they doctoral candidates or highly experienced researchers- and encourage transnational, intersectoral and interdisciplinary mobility. The MSCA enable research-focused organisations (universities, research centres, and companies) to host talented foreign researchers and to create strategic partnerships with leading institutions worldwide.

Some calls have two (2) stages and two deadlines: For two-stage submission schemes, there is a first stage and second stage evaluation (against the evaluation criteria for each stage). In these submission schemes, proposals must be approved in the first to move to the second stage. Evaluation time: For phase 1: maximum 3 months from the submission deadline. For Stage 2: Maximum 5 months from the submission deadline.
