This booklet summarizes the publication entitled *Uruguay's international cooperation* progress report 2019, which is nurtured by data collected through the Integrated System of International Cooperation Uruguay (SICI-Uy), provided by the institutions of the National System of International Cooperation, including cooperation partners which reported information through this software for the first time.

The analyzed information refers to non-reimbursable international cooperation initiatives that were active in 2018 in which Uruguay was either provider or recipient or both. Reported initiatives involved the participation of one or more national public bodies or were granted by international organizations, multilateral and bilateral funds and other countries' public bodies.

This period's data shows that Uruguay maintains a dual role in international cooperation, receiving support in strategic areas for its transition to development, but also contributing to the accomplishment of the 2030 Agenda through the provision of technical assistance and the exchanging of experiences with other countries in the region, based on its strengths and best practices.
