La Secretaría del Organismo Internacional de Energía Atómica (OIEA) saluda a los Estados Miembros del OIEA y tiene el honor de señalar a su atención la celebración del **Taller sobre Preparación y Respuesta para Casos de Emergencia Nuclear o Radiológica relacionados con el Transporte de Material Radiactivo** (en adelante denominado el “evento”) que tendrá lugar en Rabat (Marruecos) del **21 al 25 de marzo de 2022**.

La finalidad del evento es capacitar al personal sobre la manera de prepararse para casos de emergencia nuclear o radiológica relacionados con el transporte de material radiactivo y de darles respuesta.

En la reseña informativa adjunta se ofrecen más detalles sobre el evento.

El evento se celebrará en inglés.

Se invita a los Estados Miembros a designar a una o más personas para que participen en este evento en representación de su Gobierno y se los alienta encarecidamente a que seleccionen con ese fin a mujeres calificadas.

Por lo general, el OIEA no está en condiciones de sufragar los gastos de viaje ni de otra índole de los participantes en el evento. No obstante, dispone de fondos limitados para ayudar a cubrir los gastos de asistencia de determinados participantes. Esa ayuda puede ofrecerse normalmente, previa solicitud expresa, a un participante por país siempre que, en opinión del OIEA, la persona para la que se solicite pueda hacer una contribución importante al evento.

Cabe señalar que el OIEA no paga ninguna indemnización por daños o pérdida de efectos personales. Tampoco proporciona seguro médico a los participantes en eventos del OIEA. Por lo tanto, se recomienda que estas personas adopten las medidas necesarias para contratar por su cuenta un seguro privado. No obstante, el OIEA cubrirá mediante un seguro los accidentes y las enfermedades claramente relacionados con los servicios prestados al OIEA.

Las designaciones deben presentarse al OIEA por conducto de la autoridad nacional competente (el Ministerio de Relaciones Exteriores, la Misión Permanente ante el OIEA o la Autoridad Nacional de Energía Atómica), a más tardar el **15 de enero de 2022**, por medio del formulario de participación adjunto (Formulario A). Los formularios de participación debidamente cumplimentados y autorizados deben enviarse por correo electrónico a la dirección [Official.Mail@iaea.org](mailto:Official.Mail@iaea.org) o por fax al número: +43 1 26007 (no se precisan copias impresas). Asimismo, han de enviarse copias por correo electrónico a la Secretaria Científica del evento, Sra. Stacey Horvitz (correo electrónico: [S.Horvitz@iaea.org](mailto:S.Horvitz@iaea.org)), y a la Secretaria Administrativa, Sra. Andrea Santoyo Galván (correo electrónico: [A.Santoyo-Galvan@iaea.org](mailto:A.Santoyo-Galvan@iaea.org)). Una vez recibidas las designaciones oficiales, la Secretaria Científica del evento contactará directamente a los participantes en relación con otras cuestiones de organización, como los detalles del viaje, según proceda.

En caso de que los Gobiernos desearan, además, nombrar uno o más observadores para que prestasen asistencia y asesoramiento a los participantes designados, se les ruega que comuniquen al OIEA el nombre y las señas de esos observadores a más tardar en la fecha antes indicada. De conformidad con las normas establecidas, corresponde a los Gobiernos sufragar los gastos de asistencia de los observadores que envíen a los eventos del OIEA. Este no paga ninguna indemnización por daños o pérdida de efectos personales de los observadores, ni por enfermedad, lesión o fallecimiento durante los viajes o en relación con su asistencia a los eventos del OIEA.

La Secretaría del Organismo Internacional de Energía Atómica aprovecha esta oportunidad para reiterar a los Estados Miembros del OIEA el testimonio de su distinguida consideración.

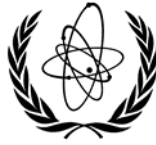

## **Information Sheet**

### **Introduction**

The General Safety Requirements *Preparedness and Response for a Nuclear or Radiological Emergency* (IAEA Safety Standards Series No. GSR Part 7) was published in 2015 under the joint sponsorship of 13 international intergovernmental organizations. This publication establishes requirements for an adequate level of preparedness and response for a nuclear or radiological emergency, irrespective of the initiator of the emergency.

The Specific Safety Requirements *Regulations for the Safe Transport of Radioactive Material, 2018 Edition* (IAEA Safety Standards Series No. SSR-6 (Rev.1)) establishes requirements to ensure a high level of safety for the transport of radioactive material. However, emergencies during transport of radioactive material can occur and suitable arrangements should be defined to ensure adequate response in that case. Emergencies during transport of radioactive material are included in Emergency Preparedness Category IV, which is applicable to all Member States. This publication requires arrangements for emergency preparedness and response involving the transport of radioactive material,

based on GSR Part 7 requirements, and considering unique hazards, considerations, and response actions involved in these kinds of emergencies.

## **Objectives**

The purpose of the event is to train personnel how to prepare for and respond to nuclear or radiological emergencies involving the transport of radioactive material.

The workshop consists of lectures, work sessions, and exercises delivered in a virtual environment. By the end of the course, the participants will understand and be able to implement knowledge from the following topics:

- National arrangements and framework for EPR
- Requirements of the transport regulations relevant to EPR
- Hazard assessment for transport of radioactive materials
- Preparedness and response elements for transport emergencies
- Development of concept of operations for transport emergencies
- Plans and procedures for response to transport emergencies
- Nuclear security events as emergency initiators
- Training, drills, and exercises for transport emergencies

## **Target Audience**

The training course is open to 30 participants from all Member States. The nominated participants should be responsible developing and implementing emergency preparedness and response arrangements at the national, regional, local, or facility level within any relevant organization (e.g. regulatory bodies, national competent authorities, civil defence/civil protection/emergency management agencies, emergency responders, consignors, carriers, consignees).

The individual skills and actual work performed by the nominees, as well as relevant background activities in their home countries, will be considered in the selection process. As the training course will be conducted in English, participants should have sufficient proficiency to follow lectures and express themselves in this language without difficulty.

English

## Participation and Registration

All persons wishing to participate in the event have to be designated by an IAEA Member State or should be members of organizations that have been invited to attend.

In order to be designated by an IAEA Member State, participants are requested to send the **Participation Form (Form A)** to their competent national authority (e.g. Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Permanent Mission to the IAEA or National Atomic Energy Authority) for onward transmission to the IAEA by **15 January 2022**. Each Member State is invited to designate no more than 3 participants for this event and rank the submitted nominations. **Participation Forms (Form A)** received after the deadline or applications sent directly by individuals, or by institutions, cannot be considered.

Selected participants will be informed in due course on the procedures to be followed with regard to administrative and financial matters.
